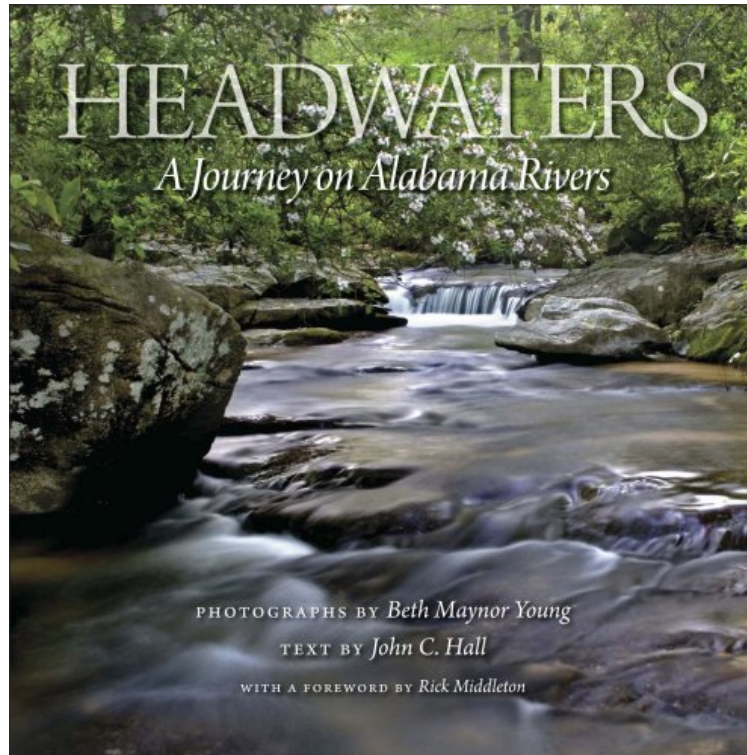

Starting our trip on the tiny springs that merge and blend into rivers that flow to the Gulf of Mexico, it is as if we are floating in a canoe, all the while listening to the languid but passionate Southern accent of John Hall, a knowledgeable and friendly guide.
