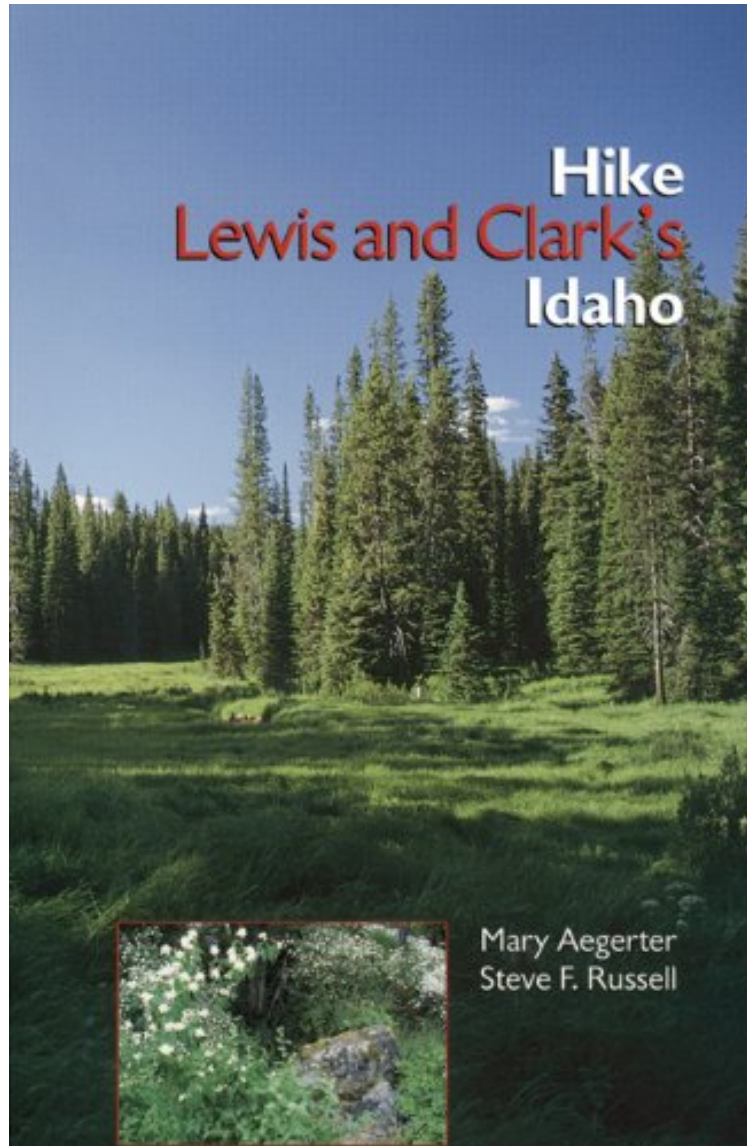

Be aware that it covers a specific area of Idaho - Route 12 - so you'll want another book if you plan to be

elsewhere. Forty-four hikes are described in detail, with directions to each. There are good maps for each hike, a graph of elevation gain and distance, and description of difficulty.
