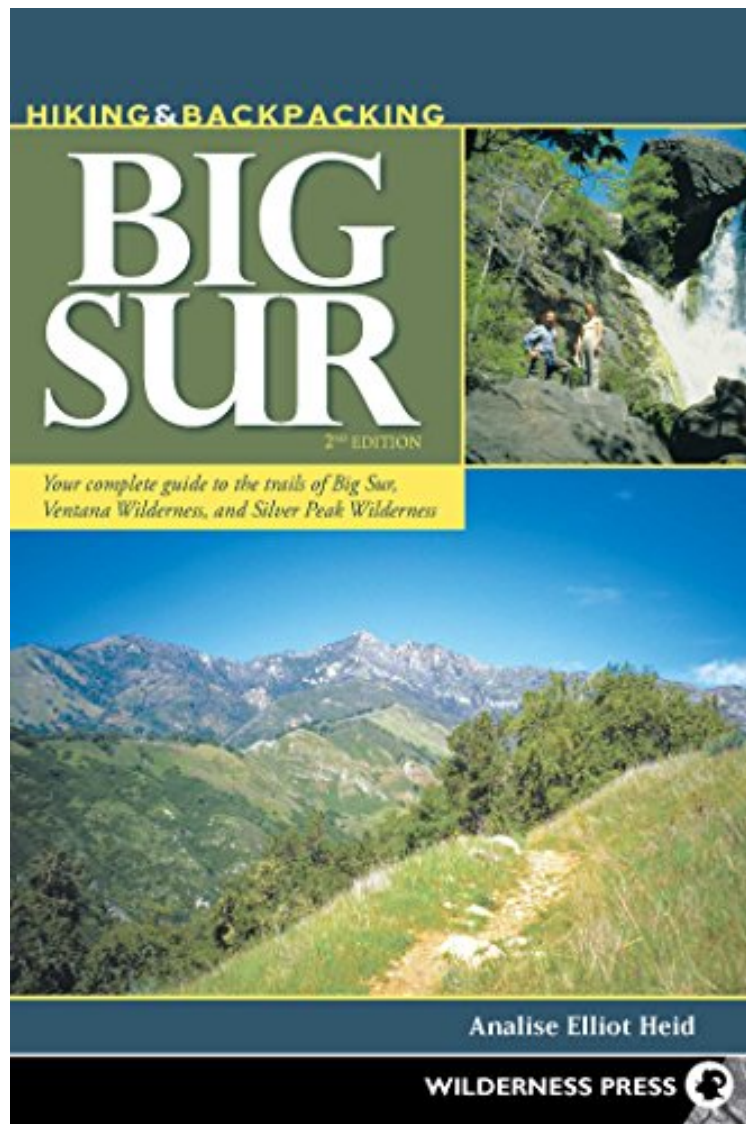

Based on the author's detailed assessments of each major trail leading into the wilderness, we chose a less-traveled trailhead and campsites we would have otherwise overlooked. Mileage and landmark descriptions were generally accurate; the maps were adequate, but it would be helpful to show mileage between major sites. Her frequent notes of caution about hazards may be intimidating to the casual hiker, but better to be over-cautious about poison oak, ticks, flies, etc. The highest tribute to a travel guide book is that my copy was dog-eared, water-stained and thoroughly used up by the time I got home.6 of 6 people found the following review helpful.
