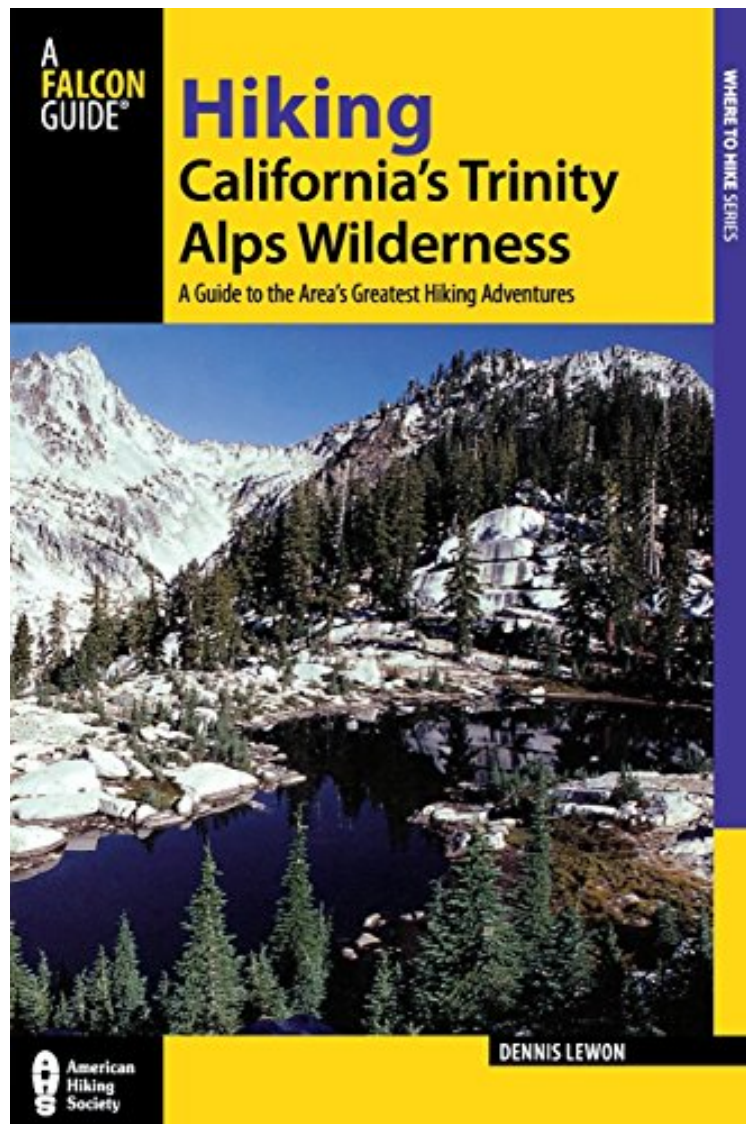

By Customer A decent guide BUT it omits the entire western half of the Trinity Alps Wilderness Area (often referred to as the "Green Trinities"). The natural history info at the start of the book is nice but it is very thin in depth. For example, it makes no mention of the significant fact that there are parts of three different mountain ranges in the wilderness area or that those ranges are quite different from another. Similar for botany info. That said, if you want to go to the eastern half of the wilderness, this is likely the best guide you'll find.
