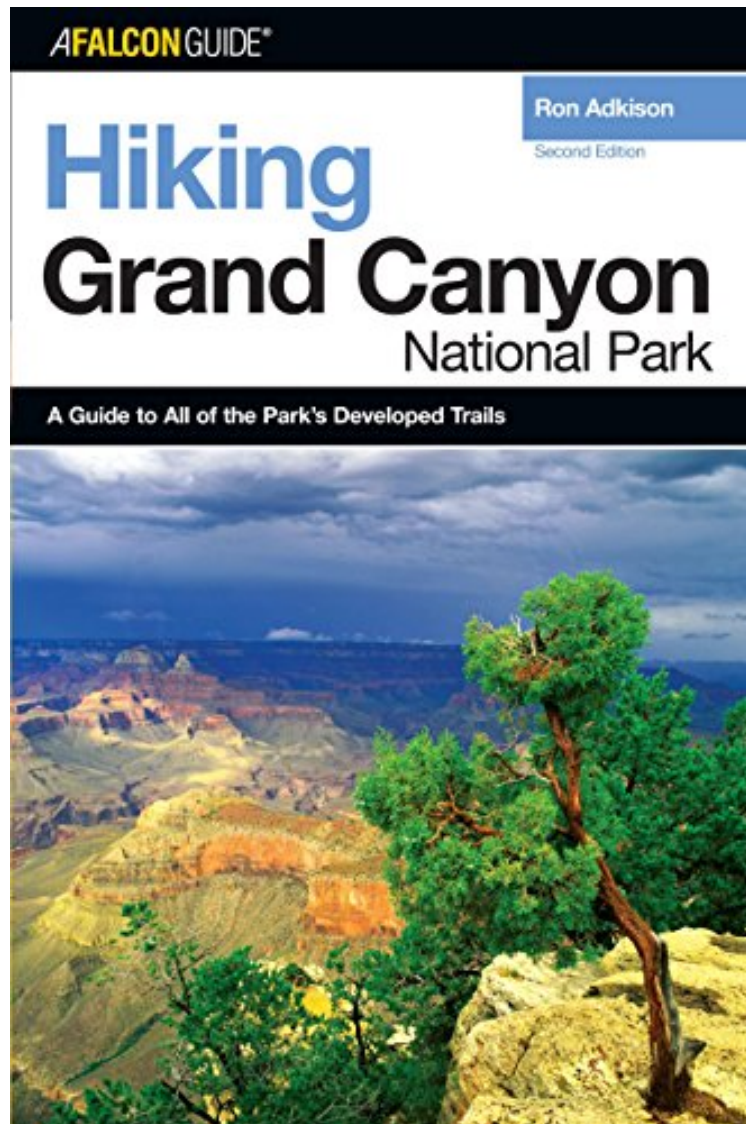

Hiking the Grand Canyon's Geology (Hiking Geology) (HTGCG) by Lon Abbott and Teri Cook. I liked the straightforward and informative approach that Ron Adkinson takes in this book. The Grand Canyon is a big place with a lot of alternatives for trips. I was able figure out which trails I want to take using this book. I especially like the capsule summary of each route that have clear ratings for the difficulty, water availability, average hiking times, suggested cache points, and distance. Compared to this book, I found the HTGCG by Lon Abbott and Teri Cook nearly as good but the focus on the geology in HTGCG makes it harder to pull out the hiking information. We hiked down the South Kaibab Trail to the Bright Angel Campground (2 nights) and back out on the Bright Angel Trail with an overnight stop at the Indian Gardens Campground.. The book does a good job of describing the trails and campgrounds. It talks about seasons, weather and tips for making the hike. Using these two resources we had a very successful hike with no surprises.
