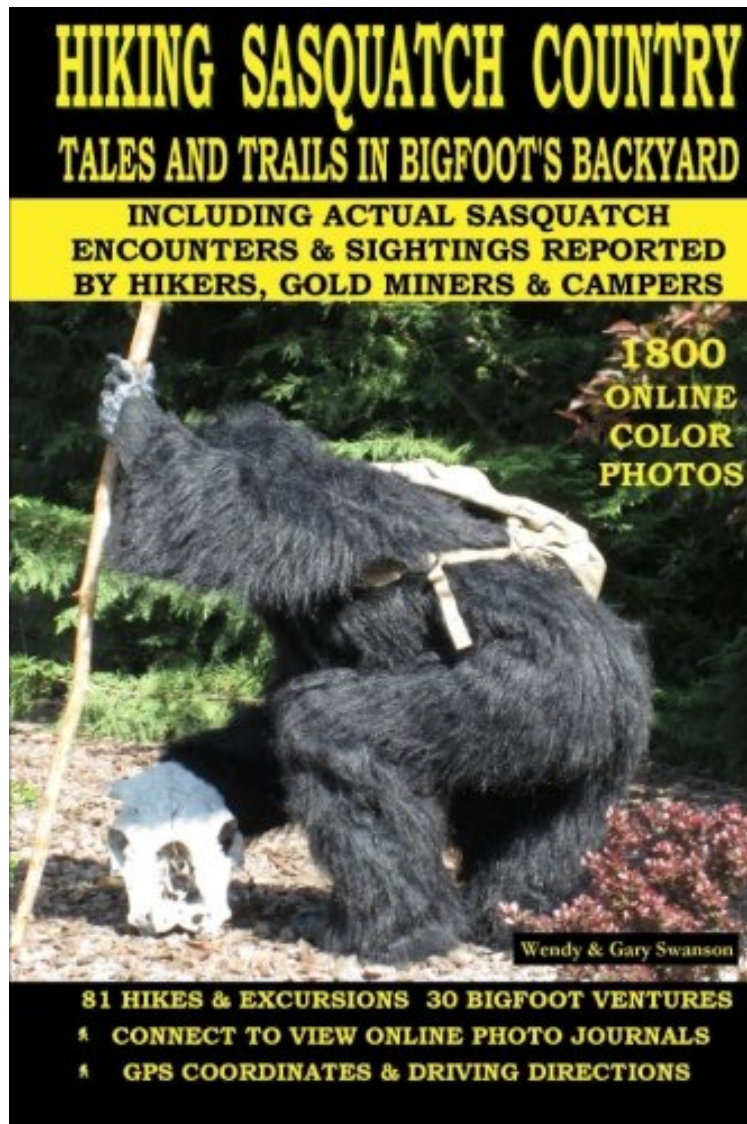

Read about the Sasquatch that killed a huge cougar by ripping its head and tail off, which according to local officials, is a customary trait of the Bigfoot likely due to its fear of the lions; and the resident gold miner who had a one ton boulder pushed onto his storage shed at his claim; and many more tales of these close encounters of the wild kind!
