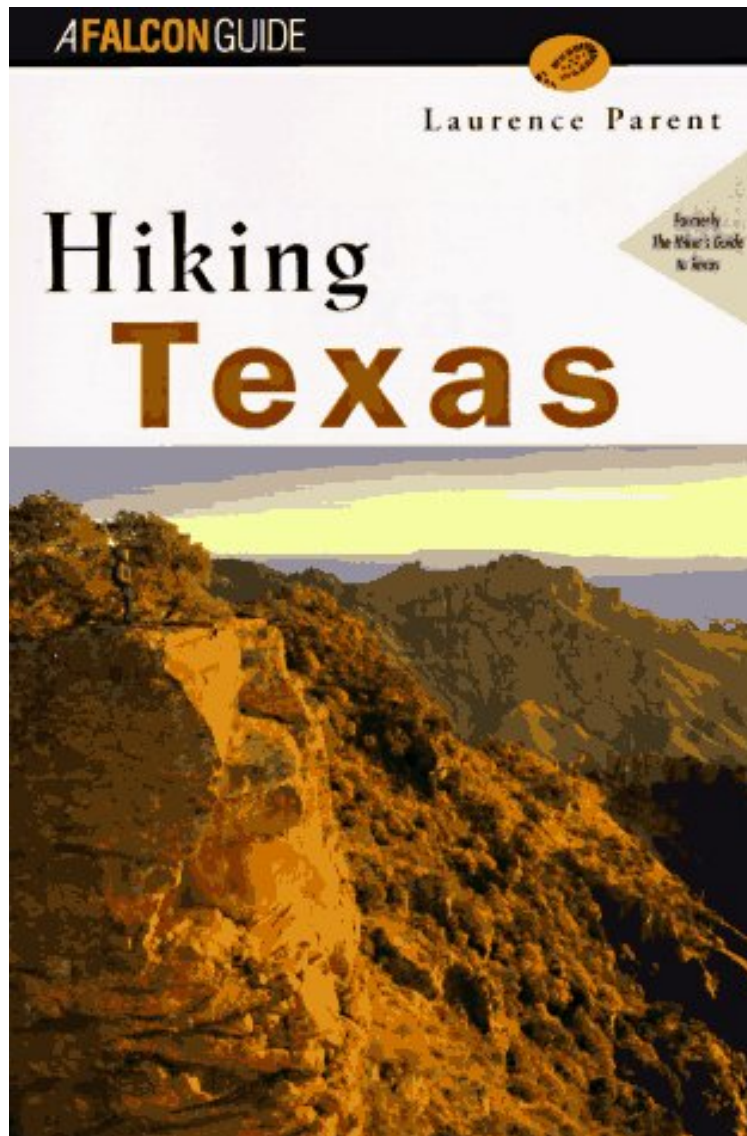

By Customer I'm an experienced hiker new to the Hill Country of Texas and this book has been a good place to start when looking for a new hike. The directions to the trailheads are accurate and the author does a good job with the general overviews of the state parks. However, I like the trails maps provided by Texas Parks and Wildlife better than the maps in the book.

The book doesn't always use the trails' names which I miss especially when the author merges one designated park trail with another for his trail in the book. I also think the difficulty ratings in the book may be optimistic and they don't reconcile with the difficulty ratings stated by the park. For example, the book's Inks Lake trail is rated easy but the two trails it combines are both rated moderate by the park. I'm finding the Texas Parks' rating to be more accurate and this may discourage people new to hiking or those with physical limitations.
