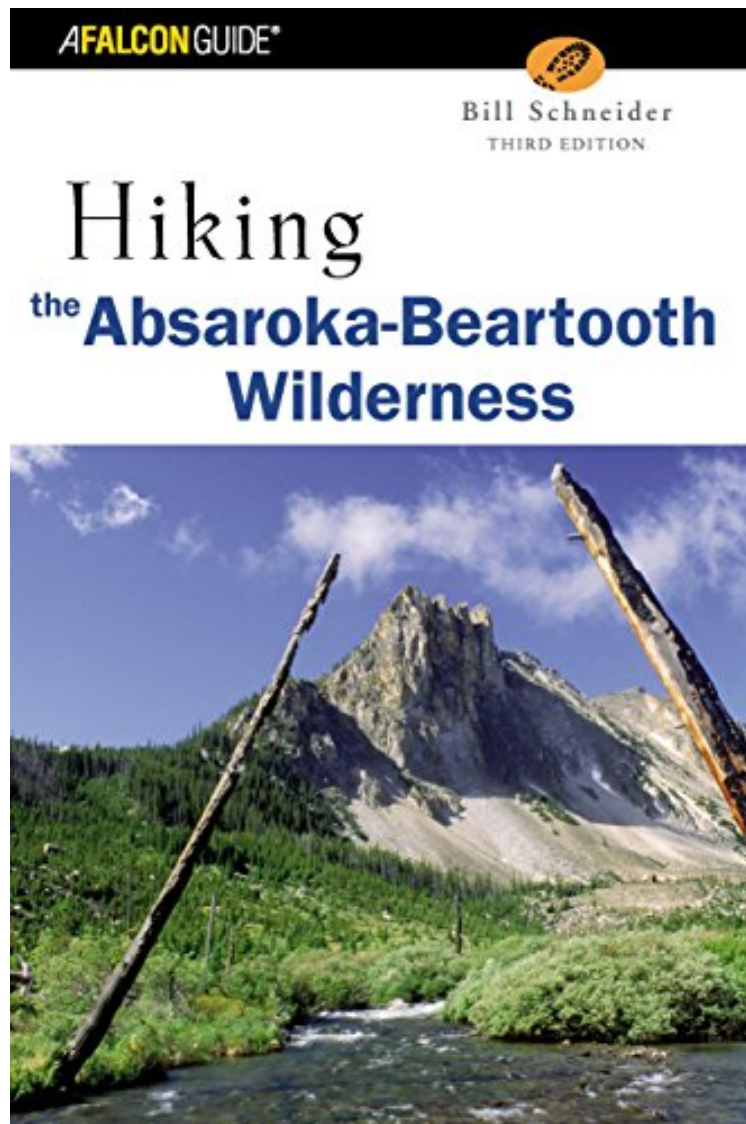

distance, traffic rating, list of USGS maps, starting point, how to get to the trailhead and trailhead facilities. Then there is a detailed description, including camping and fishing. It is illustrated with simple trail maps. These are not big on topography but give you an idea of the layout, trailheads, lakes and peaks. It has abundant, fuzzy black white photos. 63 hikes are described. Also very good is the section in the introduction that lists the hikes in various categories, such as length and categories like "For photographers" or "For people who wouldn't mind seeing a grizzly bear." I have not yet compared the descriptions to boots on the ground, however, so can't vouch for the accuracy of any descriptions. 1 of 1 people found the following review helpful.
