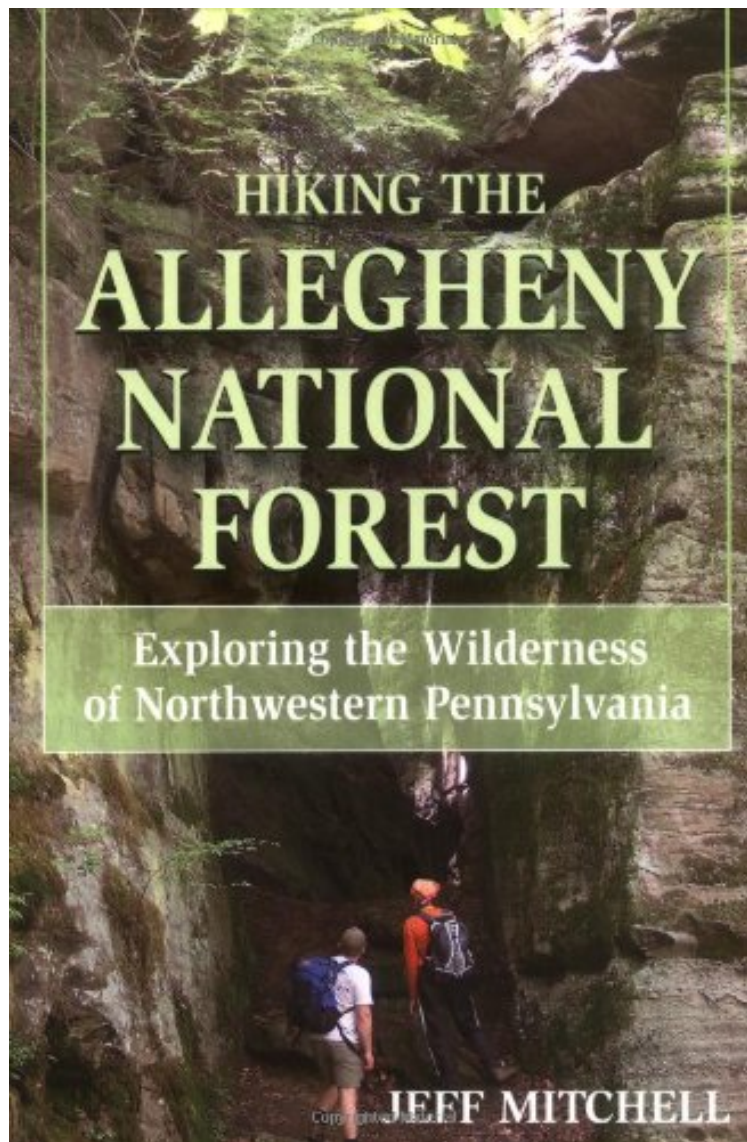

I'm a climber and there is very little climb information, but it clearly spells out some really spectacular spots. There are very few illustrations or images. The map(s) are a little vague so I would recommend printing off another online to reference roads etc just to find the trail. It might be a little difficult for a lay person to understand some of the explanations, and on more than one occasion the landmarks were dated and therefore useless, but I have found some real gems with this book. I can not find a better book or better information from any source. If you hike there a lot, or you are even just planning a weekend vacation, this is worth the money to just choose the right trails.
