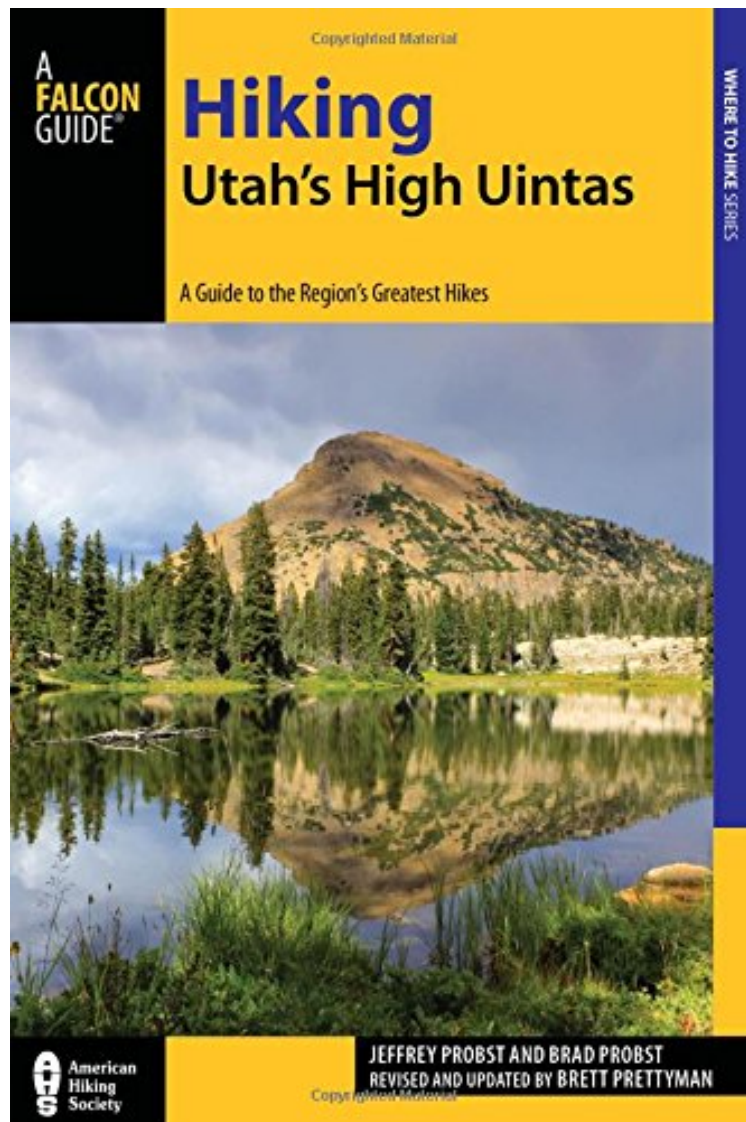

If you expect this book to be about hiking, you will probably be disappointed. Nearly all of the 100 hikes are short out-and-back trips to lakes. The main focus is on the fish in the lakes, not the scenery along the route, which I think most hikers would say is more important. If you want to plan a backpacking trip for a few days, you're mostly on your own. The book will help a little, I suppose, but the the trails in the book can't be combined very well into a longer trip. OTOH, if you're a fisherman who enjoys the hike to the lake, this may be the book for you.

Firsthand descriptions of 99 routes throughout the backcountry wilderness of Utah's Uinta Mountains and High Uintas Wilderness, including easy day hikes to great fishing spots, adventurous treks to remote campsites, and extended backpacking trips for intrepid wilderness travelers.
