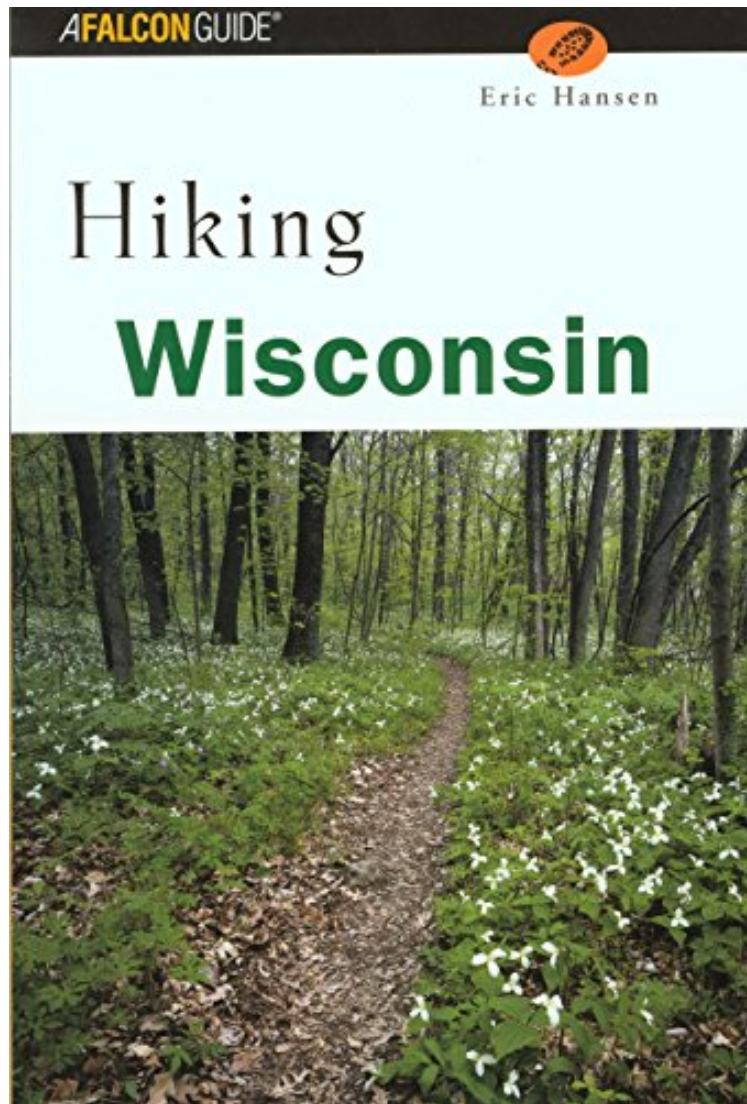

This book contained a major error in directions which cost us much time. The directions to the trailhead for Blackhawk Ridge trailhead called for travel on Dunlap Hollow Road. DuchekThis is a nice book that lists a bunch of hikes you can do in Wisconsin. Most emphasis

is on scattered locations in far northern Wisconsin and it also has some elsewhere as well. I'd point out that unlike *Backpacking Wisconsin*, which focuses on longer hikes, this one lays out shorter hikes though it has information on how you could lengthen the hikes. It also has emphasis on the route of the hikes, with less information on what to see along the route such as wildlife and birds. On the other hand, it has little information on Wisconsin's two national scenic trails, the Ice Age Trail and (part of) the North Country Trail, though it does give hikes along these. I'd recommend the book overall but I think it could have been a bit more comprehensive and by now it's a bit out of date. Note: One of the reviewers of *Backpacking Wisconsin* complained that he/she wanted more info on water sources, etc... and would purchase this guide instead. I will just point out that this book is not geared toward longer hikes. For those looking for detailed information on longer hikes in Wisconsin, I recommend looking for specific sources and not a book like this.
