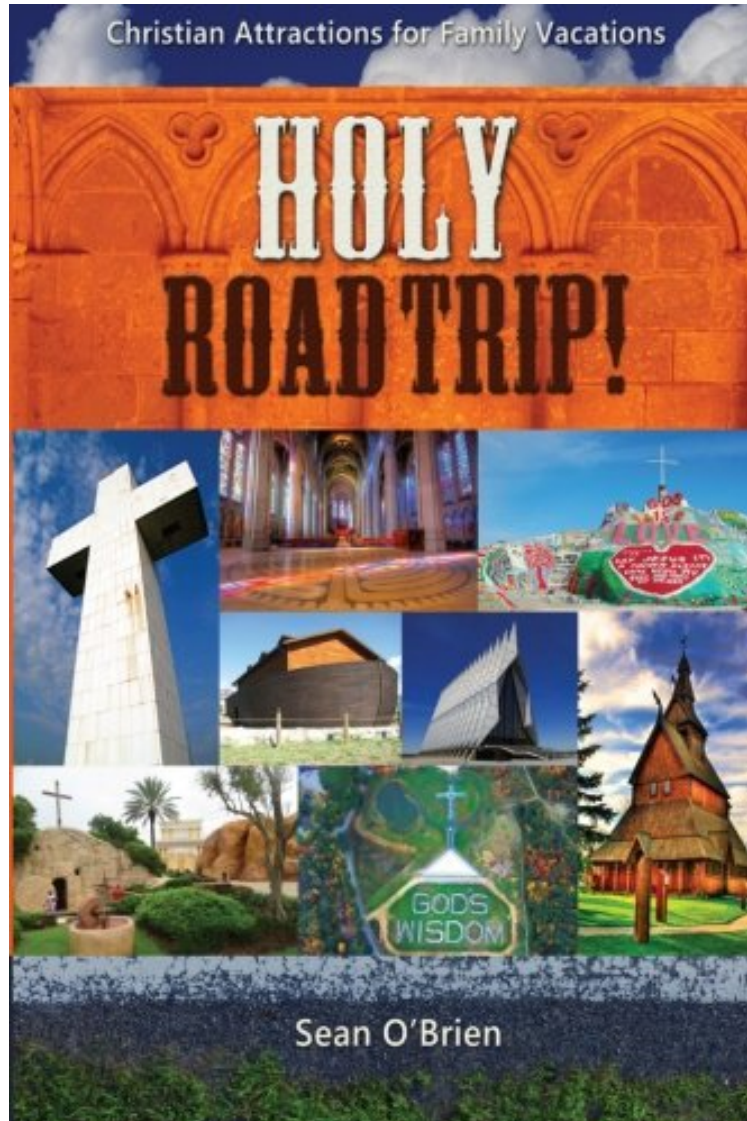

For about the same price that you'd typically pay for a fold out map at a gas station you can grab this quirky little guide. It has a list of Christian related attractions for nearly every state in the US and even a handful of Canadian attractions as well. It even includes a concise section called "World Religions" which lists some attractions for other faiths as well. Some of the attractions are more conservative, such as the Museum of Biblical Art in New York, while some of the attractions are down right bizarre. "Noah's Ark" in Oregon is a prime example. According to the book this is a restaurant shaped like the ark, complete with talking Santa Claus statues dressed like priests. Oh, and the back half of the building includes a full size reproduction of the wilderness tabernacle. That sounds like a memorable stop if I've ever heard of one. There's typically a short description written for each of the attractions in the book, and it seems like the author put in an extra measure of elbow grease to make these descriptions enjoyable and at times, even comical to read. Perhaps the most enjoyable section for me was "Top Ten Bible Road Trips". In describing The Exodus, the author writes "From Egypt to the Promised Land, this is the ultimate road trip of the Old Testament. It could have only taken a couple of weeks, but when 2 million Hebrews started grumbling and complaining, God pulls over for 40 years until the new passengers are ready." If you are planning on packing your bags and hitting the road in search of Christian themed adventure, be sure to throw this little guide into your glove box or onto your Kindle.
