With his newest release, it all comes together to give you the full HONY package that most people have come to know and love. This book is a bargain for all the passion and work that Brandon puts into this project. (The only exception being income from a handful of

I'm a serious photographer so my interest was aroused by the Facebook postings which caused me to "read" the first in the series, "Humans of New York". Light on the stories (enough to pique one's interest in the character in the shot but not much else), but the pictures were great.
