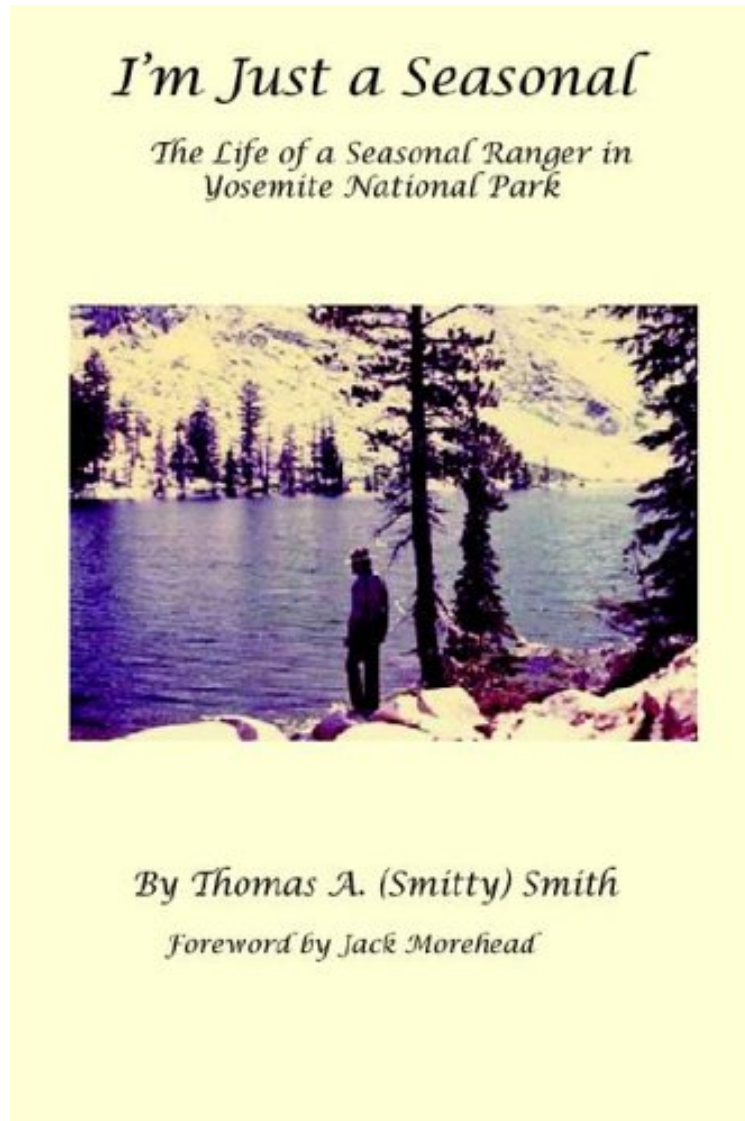

The writing jumps from very small story to very small story, most of which last only a short paragraph. There is no information about becoming a park ranger, so if you are looking for information, this is not your book. The author seems nice and well meaning enough, it's just that it seems as though he is talking to himself throughout the book. He lists the people he knew and people he misses quite often, and it just does not hit a cord for anyone who does not know him directly. There is nothing cohesive about this book, and it does not seem to come to any type of conclusion or draw any meaning, other than the author liked his job and friends. I will buy another book about rangers, because I am thinking about becoming one myself. This book did nothing to help or influence that decision.
