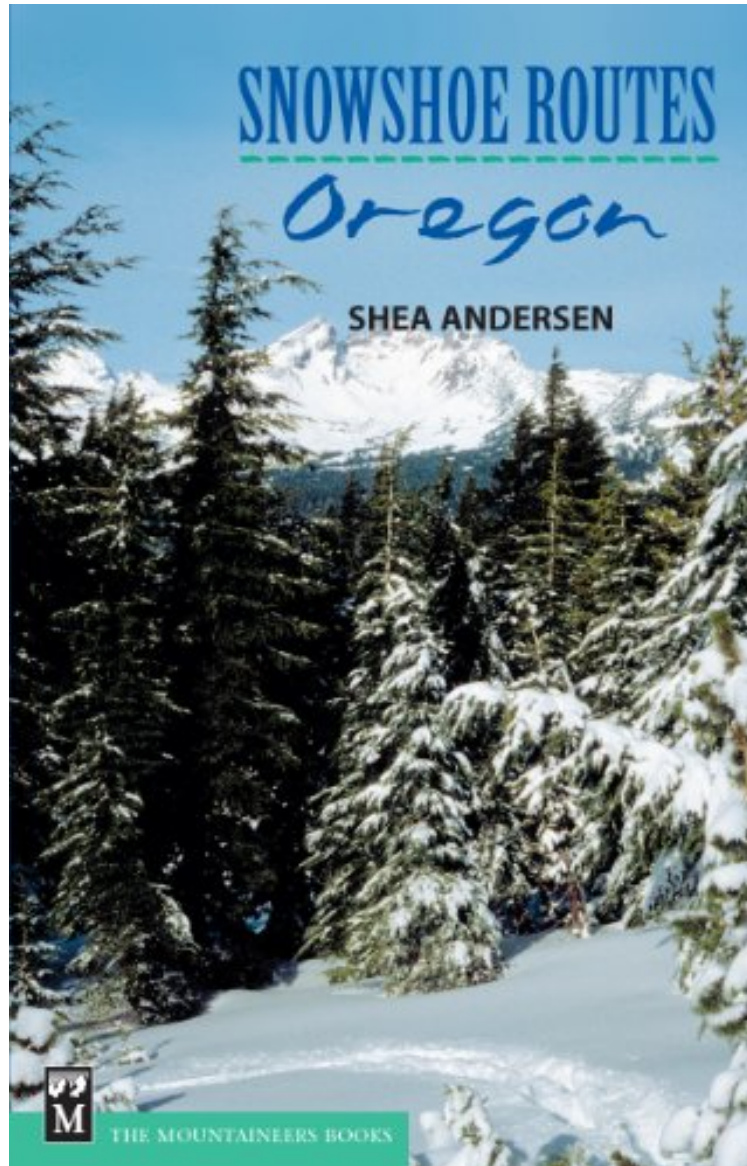

Bend. It helped us find trailheads, but the descriptions of the trails seemed very outdated. We hiked three trails and in every case either the trail was significantly different than described or the description wasn't thorough enough, which led to us never reaching the desired destination on two of the three trails. We also have the Snowshoe Routes Washington book, which is WAY better despite the content being only two years newer (2003).
