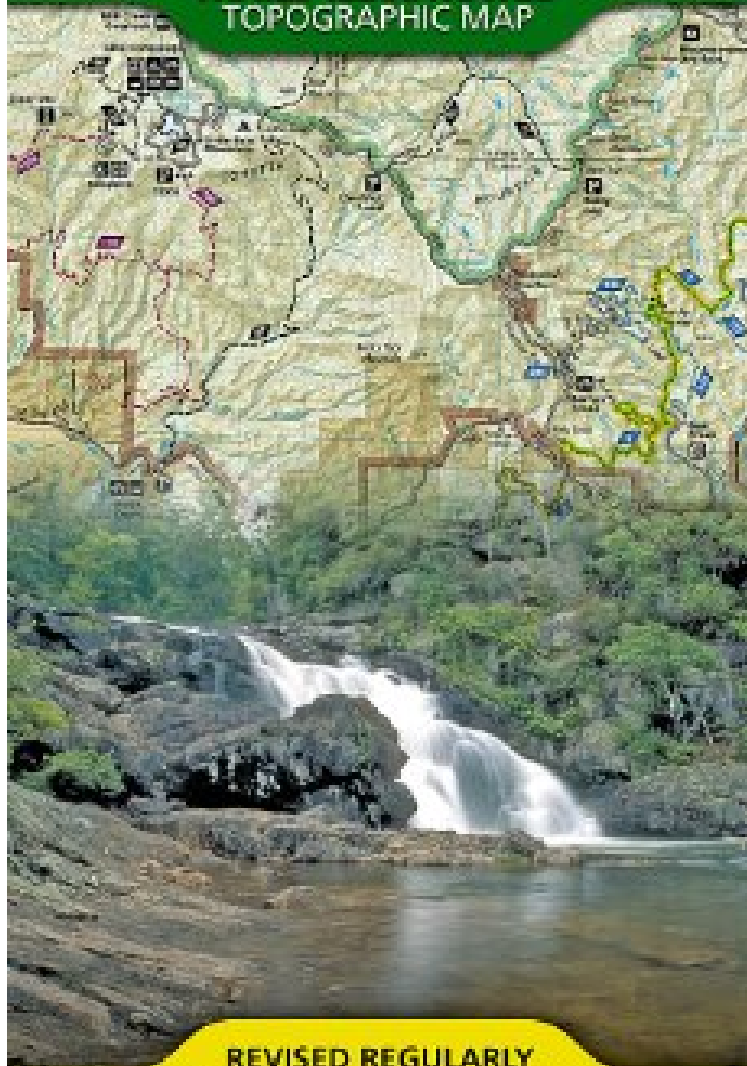

I purchased this hoping to be able to find the Beech Bottom Trail to Jacks River Falls. The map, which is built to last, didn't help me at all. I didn't even bring it on the trip. The trail is 4.5 miles long and that is about 2 inches on the map. I can't really even tell what the trail does (turns right, left, etc). This is probably good for getting to a trailhead, but after that, you need a second resource. This is the book that I really liked: <https://www..com/Waterfall-Hikes-North-Georgia-Parham/dp/1889596221>. The book takes you step by step through a trail. For example, at "Begin: From trailhead parking lot, cross the road to the signboard and continue past it and onto the trail. Mile 3.4: Bottom out at Beech Bottom. It's a little confusing here because the creek has washed out the trail. You'll need to ford the creek and continue...". It is exactly what I was looking for and I brought the book on the trail.  
In short, this map is good for overall lay of the land, but useless if you are trying to hike a specific trail.
