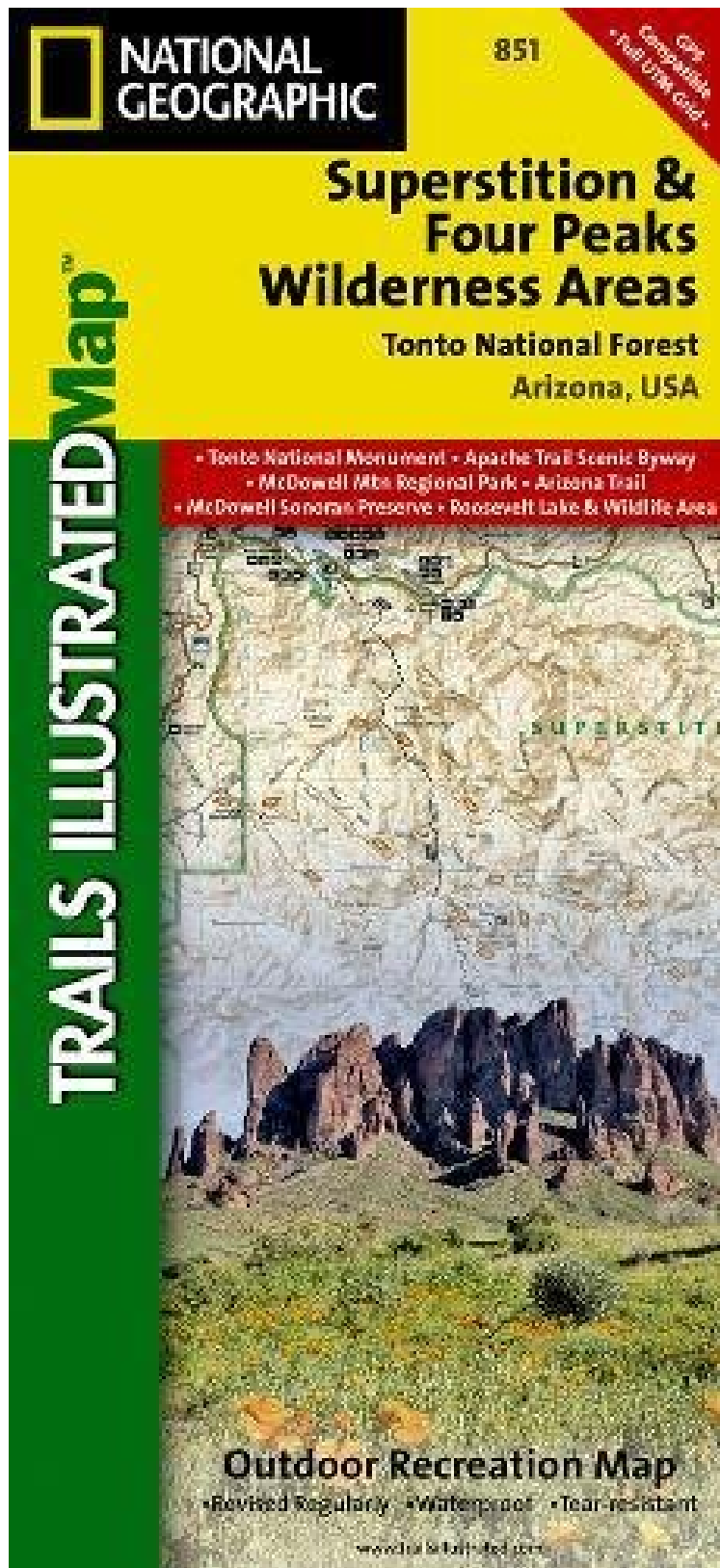

It encompasses a larger area than I wanted, but is large enough I can see the details. It is also made of a durable material. I wouldn't call it paper. This allows folding and fits nicely in my back pocket once folded over. I break this map out when planning a hike in addition to the information from hikearizona.com. FYI - I use a cell phone GPS which often drops in the Superstitions due to lack of cell towers so this map is a great back up in case batteries die, GPS breaks, etc.
