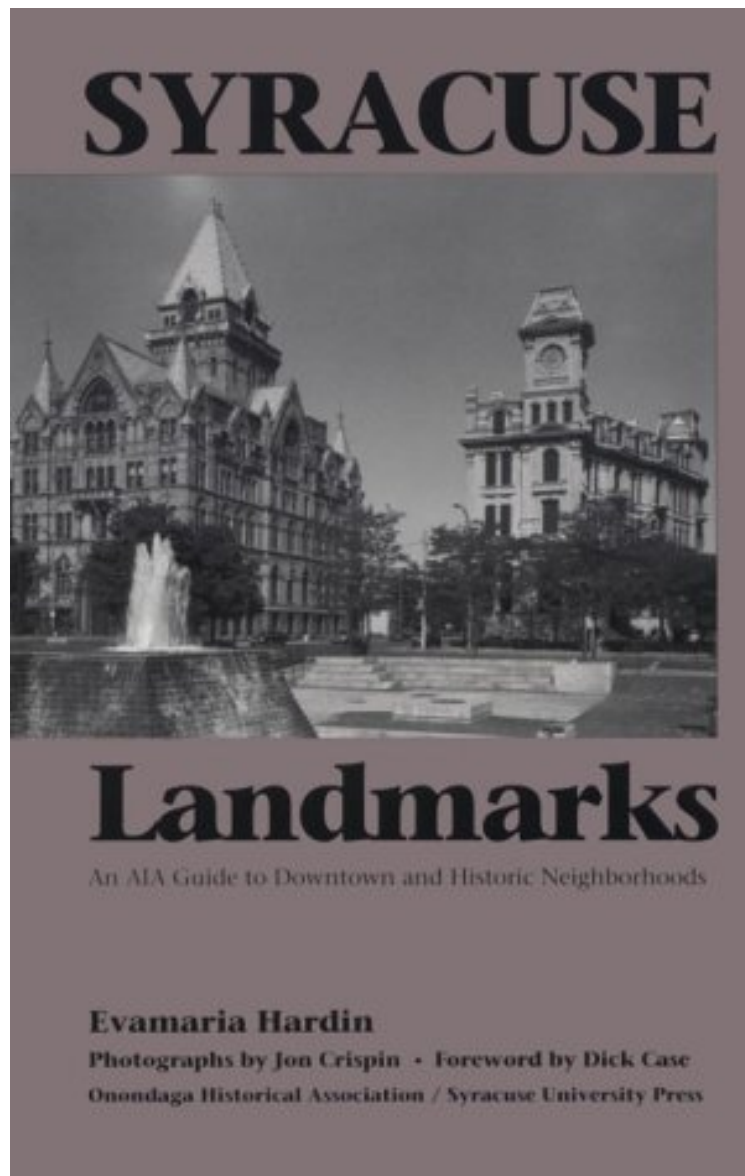

Things change and certain sites have been demolished or organizations have re-located. With that in mind, the book is well written and researched. For the serious architectural sight seer, I would recommend it highly. However, the maps are hard to follow when walking in the field. It is not clear which maps are contiguous to others. In certain areas, separate chapters appear for civil sites and religious sites. These could have been integrated on the same map. So if one were visiting area A, one sees a map of civil sites and a several chapters back, one finds the same map for religious sites. This gets cumbersome to use when in the field.
