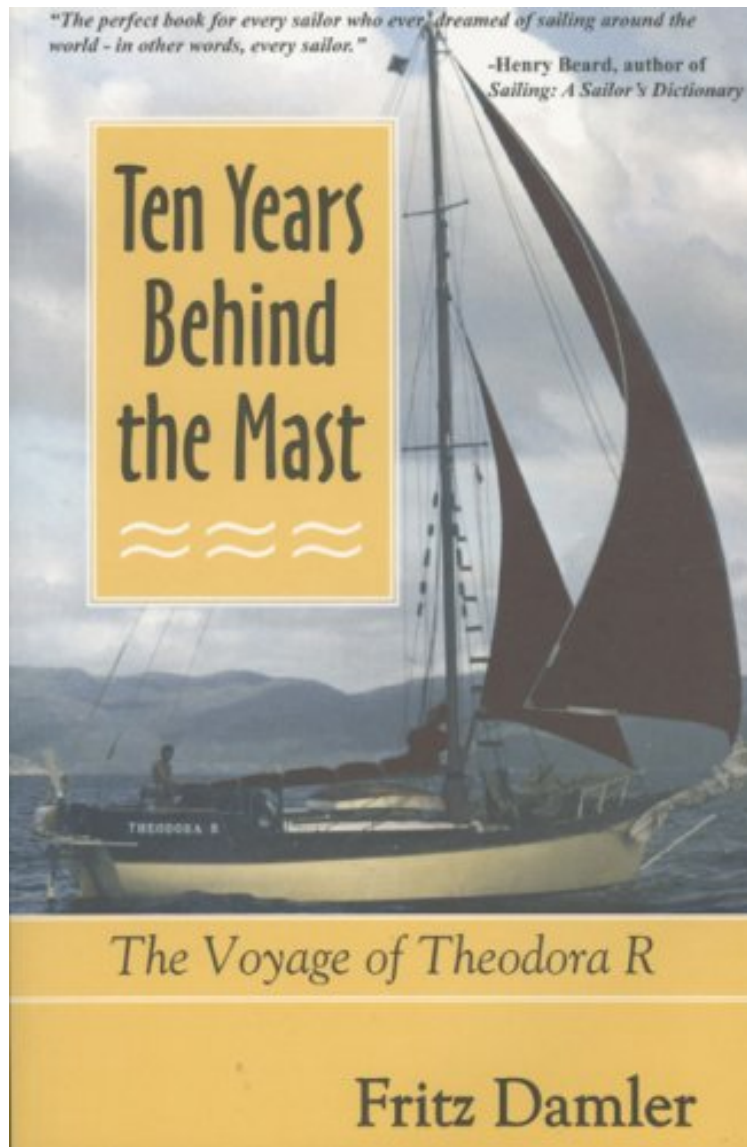

It is not a sea story, as I was somewhat expecting. Most of the descriptions are about some of the ports of call and life in general. Much of the transiting between ports is glossed over as 'just another passage' with a hiccup or two along the way, if it was at all interesting.

It's also a very small book to try and fit in 10+ years of personal history of the author. There are many people who pass in and out of the narrative with little to no depth. It reads almost like an abbreviated version or abstract of the real story.
