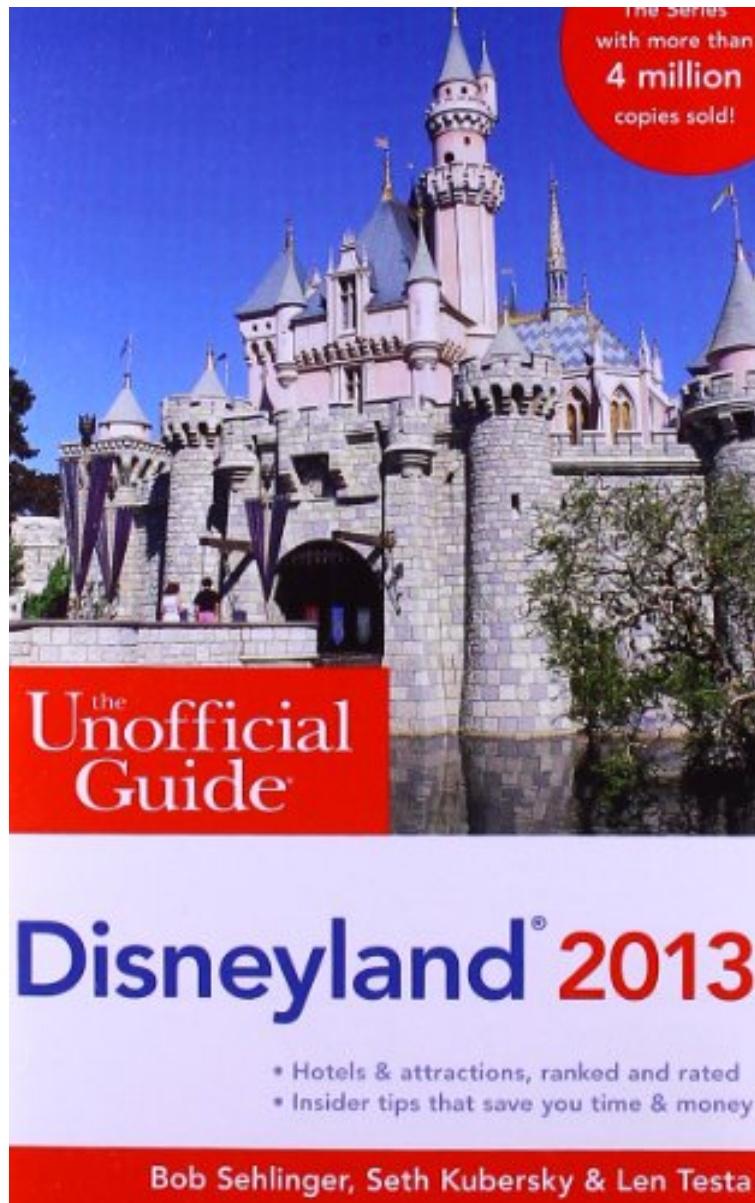

to arrive at the parks, when to start getting our spots for parades and shows, and what order to do things. We knew which rides we could just walk right onto while we waited in shifts for Fantasmic (Haunted Mansion and Pirates of the Caribbean) and which places to do twice while there was no line, but then skip later (mainly Splash Mountain). In spite of going in August, we had a fabulous time and got to do everything we wanted to at Disneyland. We didn't fit in quite everything at DCA, but we were much more successful than we would have been without this book. Our family has been hoping to go to Disneyland for years. We finally decided to make it a reality, and we've been planning this trip for almost a year. With all that emotional build-up, I've been really concerned about getting the most out of our trip and making sure it's absolutely the best experience it can be. I've only been to Disneyland myself a handful of times, and it's changed a lot, including the addition of another theme park across the street, so I was feeling overwhelmed when I found this book. Armed with this book in one hand and my laptop in the other, I was able to research everything from the food to the rides to the souvenirs. With the combined help of this book and many websites, including the new improved official Disney website, I was able to figure out exactly where to eat each day (not an easy prospect, since two of us are vegetarian and we're trying to spend the least amount of money possible), which days to stay late for the evening shows, and which days to spend at which park. We bought shirts and hats ahead of time, which my children had a great time personalizing. Because we went in mid-August, my original plan of exploring the parks land by land could have been disastrous. But we had a plan in hand that was created by experts, which makes the prospect much less daunting. We also purchased the Lots to Do in Line book by Meredith Lyn Pierce, which made the time spent in line more enjoyable, but honestly, we spent very little time in line, so we weren't able to maximize that book (which is okay!). There are all kinds of YouTube videos and websites with detailed and helpful information out there, but I needed a book with most of the information all in one place. I added copious notes from other sources. (It would have been nice to have some empty pages at the end for this purpose.) We saw other people checking out our book, and one man even asked if he could take a picture of the cover so he could acquire his own copy. The one thing this book is lacking that I had to go searching for was meal pricing. It gives you an indication of how expensive the food is, but by whose measure? For us, there's a big difference between "under twenty" and "under ten," and it's hard to determine portion size ("medium to large" is insufficient, IMO). Maybe it's because the menus change so often that it would be impractical. I was able to go online to find menus and pricing, and I added the actual price ranges for the less expensive options myself. Really, though, I think that's what the author intended, since he gives lists of online resources.
