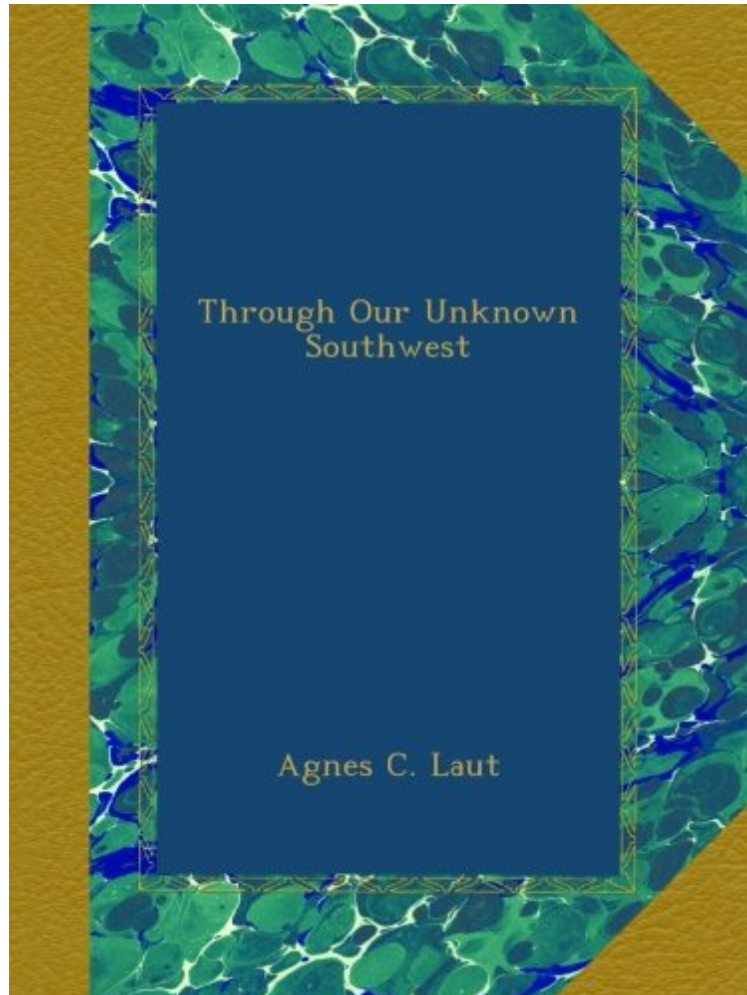

This book was originally published prior to 1923, and represents a reproduction of an important historical work,

maintaining the same format as the original work. While some publishers have opted to apply OCR (optical character recognition) technology to the process, we believe this leads to sub-optimal results (frequent typographical errors, strange characters and confusing formatting) and does not adequately preserve the historical character of the original artifact. We believe this work is culturally important in its original archival form. About the Author Agnes C. Laut was born in Huron County, Ontario in 1871. She was a reporter and editorial writer for the Manitoba Free Press in the 1890s, then a wide-ranging travel writer. Her books include *Lords of the North*, *Heralds of Empire*, *The Story of the Trapper*, *Pathfinders of the West*, *Vikings of the Pacific*, *Canada at the Crossroads*, and *The Romance of the Rails*. She died in 1936.
