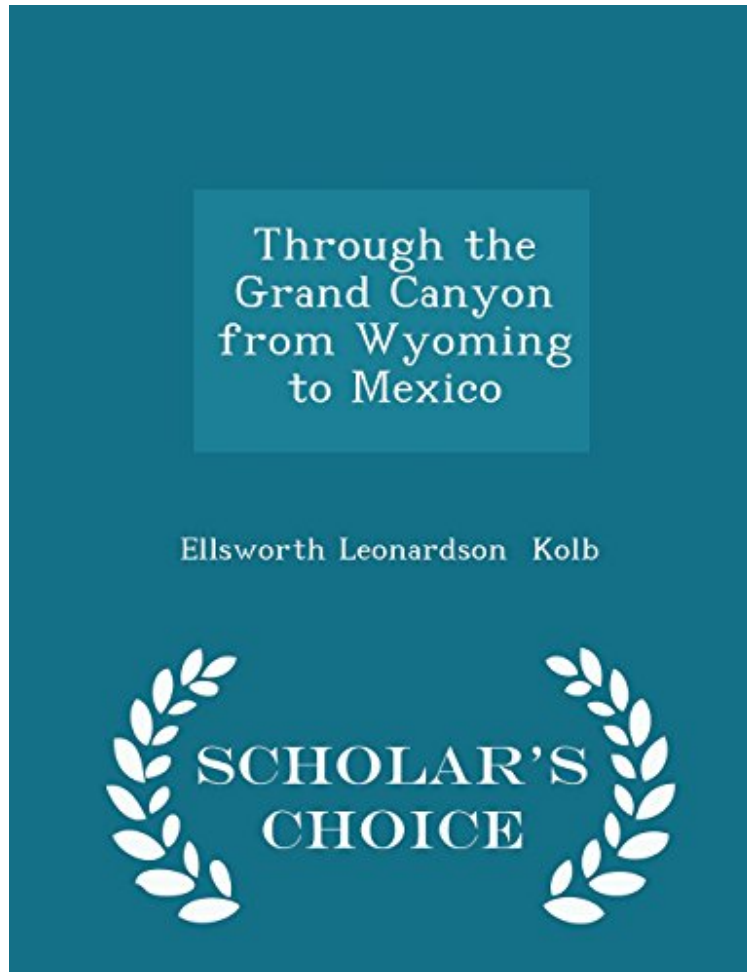

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About the Author ELLSWORTH L. KOLB moved to Needles, California, shortly after the making of the film, but continued his work on the Colorado, teaming up with a barnstormer to pilot the first plane ever to fly in and out of the Grand Canyon. He passed away in 1961 at the age of 83. His brother Emery Kolb took the movie on the road but returned to the Canyon and served as lead boatman for a United States Geological Survey expedition through the Grand Canyon to map and survey the gorge in 1923. He continued to photograph tourists along Bright Angel Trail until his death in 1976 at the age of 95.
