I found the information in this very slim volume to be what you could find a) in one of the larger, more well-written travel books and, b) easily available online at any of the travel webpages. While some of the anecdotal stories can be interesting, this book will offer only redundant information you can find elsewhere in a better-presented format. Not really useful as a travel resource for the serious vacation planner.
